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Health through Oscillations and Waves

At a time when electricity and radioelectricity are given a prominent place in physics, when it is claimed that all matter is explained by the electron and all movement by the wave, it is essential not to ignore the power of such agents in therapeutics. A french scientist who is not indifferent to the fate of humanity, M. Georges Lakhovsky, has undertaken to fill this gap by studying, in the light of the work of his illustrious predecessor, Prof. d'Arsonval, the extent to which natural and artificial electric waves condition our existence and what forces we can draw from them to maintain our health and treat our diseases. The method of the oscillating circuit, which he has devised and whose applications already appear so fruitful, is the result of a series of researches, both theoretical and practical, which M. Lakhovsky has been pursuing for many years on the mystery of the origin of life and on the problem of the treatment of cancer. This bold innovator has shown in a series of works that relate his work: *The Origin of Life*, *The Univerision*, *Contribution to the Etiology of Cancer*, *The Secret of Life* (Gauthier-Villars, editor), that radio waves should not be considered only as the most advanced of our means of communication, but as the very principle on which the universe rests, in particular organized beings and life. This is how M. Lakhovsky was led to conceive the oscillatory nature of the living cell and of organized beings, just as the physicist conceived the oscillatory nature of the material molecule, of the atom and of the whole universe. This hypothesis has been progressively verified by his original and fruitful experiments on the treatment of cancer and other diseases.

It is easy to understand why the living cell is a small electrical oscillator and resonator. The cell consists of a nucleus bathed in a liquid (protoplasma) surrounded by a membrane. The nucleus is essentially formed by tubular filaments of insulating material containing an electrically conductive saline liquid. These filaments, thus twisted on themselves in the cell, are thus real small oscillating circuits in all points comparable to the circuits, windings and coils of the receivers. The living cell can then play the role of a transmitter or a receiver of radioelectric waves of short length, which determine in the circuits of its core electric currents of very high frequency. Now, the vibration of an oscillating circuit is maintained by radiant energy and one can ask oneself where the energy comes from that makes the animal and vegetable cells vibrate, which together form what is

called "life on the surface of the Earth". In recent years, astrophysicists have revealed the existence of natural electrical waves of all lengths and particularly of very penetrating waves, which, because of their universal nature, they have named cosmic waves. These waves, which come from the interference of all astral rays, have such a strength that they pass through a thickness of 7 meters of lead and 50 meters of certain grounds. It is even probable that there are some cosmic waves capable of crossing the whole Earth. Mr. Lakhovsky has succeeded in showing, by a succession of experiments, that the cellular oscillation of living organisms is maintained by cosmic radiation. But a major drawback results from the constant variation of the field intensity of these waves and their frequencies, as a result of the rotation of the Earth in the cosmic universe. The extreme variation of these waves explains precisely why it is so difficult to maintain the cellular equilibrium of living organisms, i.e., health. It is reasonable to believe that if the cosmic waves remained constant in value and frequency, we would not experience illness, suffering or death. The problem of maintaining health therefore comes down to maintaining the constancy of the vital oscillation and, consequently, the regularization of the cosmic wave field around the subject. The notion of cellular oscillation, which M. Georges Lakhovsky has so clearly defined, is, if we think about it, no more singular than that of the microbe. Thus in his last work *The Secret of Life*, he says:

"What is a microbe? Is it a microscopic animal that has a mouth and teeth to devour the "healthy cells of the tissues that surround it? Not at all. Does it act by chemical reaction like a corrosive substance? Not at all, because it has a composition more or less analogous to that of the cell it is attacking. The microbe is simply an oscillating circuit which, by coupling with the healthy cells, forces them to oscillate at a frequency different from their own, or stifles their oscillation by introducing electrical resistances (toxins) into the circuit of these cells, or emits parasitic radiation which interferes with the radiation of the healthy cells.

The disease, a struggle between the microbe and the healthy cell, is thus reduced to an oscillatory imbalance caused by the alteration of the cellular vibration under the action of the microbe. Generally speaking, and even if it is not a microbial disease, the disease results from the oscillatory imbalance due to the weakening or excess of the cellular radiation. Through his investigations in all branches of the physical sciences, Lakhovsky has

succeeded in showing that there are permanent natural causes of oscillatory disequilibrium, such as those arising, for example, from the nature of the soil. A reinforcement of cosmic waves occurs in electrically conductive soils, such as plastic clay, marl, ferruginous and carbonaceous soils. This radiation and the resulting interference cause a rapid division of healthy cells into neoplastic cells such as those that form cancerous tumors, or cause the oscillatory imbalance of cells that leads to many diseases.

In order to avoid the harmful effects of the oscillatory imbalance, it is essential to ensure the regularization of the cosmic field in the vicinity of the living organism by means of electrime filtration, as M. Lakhovsky luminously explained in *Contribution à l'étiologie du Cancer*. This result is obtained either by acting on the electrical constants of the cell by modifying its chemical composition, or by placing one or more oscillating circuits around the subject or on the subject itself, acting as electrical filters in the form of necklaces or belts. Here is how Mr. Lakhovsky explained the functioning of this filtration:

We know that the earth's atmosphere is the seat of electromagnetic oscillations of all wavelengths and intensities, as a result of constant and innumerable electric discharges (lightning, etc.). On the other hand, we know that all electric motors with collectors and brushes, all magnetos, all traction devices, current rectifiers and most electrical applications create a whole field of permanent auxiliary waves in the atmosphere. Moreover, for the last fifteen years, the Earth has been covered with such a tight network of real factories from which come out the waves of radiocommunications, radiotelegraphy, radiotelephony, etc., that it is currently impossible to find the slightest free place available in the range of these waves. In these conditions, one can conceive that any oscillating circuit of any size and of any shape is likely to find in this vast field of waves, the proper wave on which it can oscillate; one thus notices that it is not necessary to have recourse to a generator of local waves, such as the radio-celluo-oscillator with which M. Lakhovsky cured the geraniums inoculated with cancer in 1924. This is the rational and logical explanation for the fact that the oscillating circuit used without excitation by M. Lakhovsky in his second series of experiments could also cure geraniums inoculated with cancer. Indeed, under the action of this constant field of the radioelectric waves drawn from the atmosphere and which put it in resonance, the oscillating circuit creates a local field, which channels and filters, as it were, the

cosmic waves necessary to the cellular oscillation.

This filtration is, moreover, a general phenomenon. We can see, in fact, that radiation such as light, ultraviolet rays and other electromagnetic radiation, radium, X-rays, etc., have the property, according to M. Lakhovsky, of making the cosmic waves act either to the advantage or disadvantage of the cells. On the contrary, the field created by the Lakhovsky oscillating circuit is constant and only brings into play a very gentle force. It always acts in a favorable way on the oscillation of your cell by facilitating, by the filtration of the cosmic waves, the cellular division in a regular and permanent way, which explains the vigour thus restored to the ceilules, which enables them to fight victoriously against all the diseases and against all the microbes. Since the first treatments of the geraniums of which we have just spoken, and which were the subject of communications to the Academy of Sciences and the Society of Biology, the methods discovered and recommended by Mr. Georges Lakhovsky were successfully applied in the clinics of the hospitals to many patients on the indication of their doctor, both in France and abroad. Learned practitioners, long familiar with the medical applications of electricity and radiation (radiotherapy, radiology, ultraviolet rays), immediately grasped the importance of Mr. Georges Lakhovsky's discovery and were willing to offer their assistance in putting his methods into practice and experimenting with oscillating collars and belts.

Not only in France, but also abroad, the medical profession has welcomed with interest the theory of cellular oscillation and has not been slow to apply the treatments recommended by M. Lakhovsky. Professor Sordello Attilj, a learned oncologist, director of the radiological department of the Hospital of San Spirito in Sassia, in Home, obtained such positive results with these methods that he did not hesitate to present a detailed and precise report to the Congress of Radiology in Florence (May 1928). As can be seen from the observations we have collected in this booklet, it is not in vain that most diseases have been treated by these methods involving the application of one or more oscillating circuits in the form of bracelets, necklaces, belts. Remarkable results have been obtained in many cases of cancer, even very advanced ones. One generally succeeds in localizing the disease, in suppressing the suffering, in bringing about a regression of the disease and, in a common manner, in provoking a very noticeable improvement in the general state of health and even a rejuvenation of the organism, the symptoms of which are easily observed. Some strong-minded

people have claimed that these effects of the oscillating circuits, although undeniable, would be due, for a large part, to imagination or autosuggestion. These critics are obviously unaware of the remarkable results obtained in the course of countless works on plants, animals, microbes and germs according to the theories of M. Lakhovsky by eminent scientists in all countries. These plants and microbes can certainly not be suggested by an oscillating circuit!




Fig. 1. — **Géranium traité avec le circuit oscillant ouvert.** — Autour du sujet inoculé le 4 décembre 1924, on a disposé un circuit métallique ouvert de 30 cm. de diamètre, soutenu par un support en ébonite. La photographie, prise deux mois après l'inoculation, c'est-à-dire fin janvier 1925, montre que la tumeur se développe avec la plante, qui n'a pas l'air d'en souffrir, tandis que les témoins, inoculés à la même date et placés à côté, sont déjà morts. (*Expérience faite par M. Lakhovsky à la Clinique chirurgicale de la Salpêtrière.*)

Everyone knows the now famous experiment by which M. Lakhovsky cured cancerous geraniums. Lakhovsky cured cancerous geraniums. The photographs in figures 1 and 2, taken from the Secret of Life, a work by M. Lakhovsky in which these cures were reported in detail, as well as the communication made on this subject to the Society of Biology, show how these geraniums were cured by means of an oscillating circuit. Other works undertaken on the germination of seeds by two Italian professors, G. Mezzadroli and E. Veraton, presented at the Royal Academy of the Lincei in Rome on February 17, 1929, gave remarkable results and confirmed the action of the oscillating circuit on the cell. The authors studied the germinative power of seeds on different species of beans, wheat, beets by placing around the germinator an oscillating circuit in the form of a collar. The seeds were placed in different soils: clay, humus, washed sand and moistened absorbent cotton.

The experiments refer only to germination, that is to say to the time when the plants live on their reserves. We cannot report here all the results published in this communication to the Academy, but we reproduce as an example, one of the four tables, that relating to the germination of wheat:

The authors found in all these experiments that the germinations anticipated by the oscillating circuit kept their advance in aerial development, which always remained more vigorous than that of the controls. They gave the following conclusions from their work:

1° The Lakhovsky oscillating circuit capturing the natural cosmic waves has a favorable effect on the germinative power of the seeds;

2° The increase in germination caused by the Lakhovsky oscillating circuit is between 25 and 50%.

3° The complete germination under the action of the circuit is done in approximately three days less than that of the controls;

4° The germination time can be reduced by half.

On the other hand, in a recent communication presented to the Academy of Sciences on April 15, 1929, M. Lakhovsky showed, in the light of work done at the Pasteur Institute in collaboration with M. Cesari, that microbes were killed by contact with an oscillating silver circuit immersed in a glass of water. The destruction of the bacilli is due to the contact of the microbe with the metal of the non-insulated circuit.

The observations that Mr. Georges Lakhovsky has kindly communicated to us concerning the treatment, the improvement and the cure of many diseases demonstrate that the action of the Lakhovsky oscillating circuit is the same on human diseases as on plant diseases, germination, etc. There can be no question of self-suggestion. It is therefore a physical action and not a psychic one.

OBSERVATIONS

from the report presented by Professor Sordello Attilj, Director of the Radiological Department of the Hospital of S. Spirito in Sassia in Rome, at the Congress of Radiology in Florence (May 1928).

C..., Therese, 25 years old, Vico nel Lazio (Fosinono). Diagnosis: Recurrent sarcoma of the left hand.

Two years ago, the patient was operated in Rome of sarcoma of the hand and, after about 6 months, she had a recurrence for which she was submitted in Alatri to a second intervention. She was well for a few months, after which I noticed another recurrence. At present, she has a hard swelling on the palmar side, at the level of the metacarpal V, the size of a large plum, adherent to the bone, painful, fibrous hardness. An X-ray showed the V metacarpal on the anterior side rarefied and with an area of periostitis. A Lakhovsky oscillating circuit (with a bracelet) was applied (November 1927), which the patient never removed. After 15 days, the patient was re-examined and declared that the pain had almost disappeared. After about 1 month, the swelling became softer and gave an impression of flexibility. After two months, the swelling has almost completely disappeared and it is possible to perceive the metacarpal directly.

M..., Assunta, 28 years old, Trasacco (Aquila). - Diagnosis: Recurrent sarcoma of the right breast

A year and a half ago, the patient was operated on for a large swelling in the right breast, which, on histological examination, was diagnosed as sarcoma. The patient underwent prophylactic irradiation with Röntgen rays (according to the German method). She was well for one year, after which the swelling reappeared. A new operation was tried, which allowed a partial exeresis. In December 1927, immediately below the scar, a swelling the size of a large hard nut was felt, which could not be removed and was spontaneously painful. A Lakhovsky oscillating circuit was applied around

the waist (December 1927); the patient was seen again for periods of 15 to 30 days; I was able to observe that the tumefaction had regressed continuously until it could no longer be palpated; at the same time, the pain had ceased.

E. S., 40 years old, Rome. - Diagnosis: Painful and motor disorders following a breast removal for cancer. Small metastasis on the scar.

The patient was operated in Rome, the first time in March 1925, the second time in September 1926; before the two operations, she suffered from tingling in her hands which appeared around 6 o'clock in the morning and stopped after the patient got out of bed, and which disappeared after the operation.

For some time now, the tingling in her hands has reappeared. On November 9, 1927, a Lakhovsky oscillating circuit was applied around her waist. The tingling stopped and did not reappear afterwards.

Six months before the appearance of the Lakhovsky oscillating circuit, the patient suffered from thoracic pains with crises accompanied by fever at 38° and sometimes $39^{\circ}5$, and very abundant sweats, of difficult interpretation, probably due to neurotic disorders. These phenomena persisted with the circuit, although very attenuated. About three months after the application of the circuit, the patient had an oedema accompanied by very strong pain in the left forearm (the first side operated on in serious conditions because of the great extension of the disease) with the formation of a swelling the size of a pea, of a greyish-white color, situated in the skin of the forearm, phenomena which had lasted for about fifteen days. They ceased after the application of a second Lakhovsky oscillating circuit (bracelet). At the same time, the edema disappeared and with it the feeling of tension (2 to 3 days later) and the small swelling 4 to 5 days later.

Following the application of the bracelet to the left arm, the pains probably due to neurotic disorders ceased at the same time[^]. One evening, the patient, who had to go out, removed the bracelet without putting it back on, and went home. The next evening, the very strong thoracic pains reappeared. The use of antineuralgics was without results. Around 2 o'clock in the night, she remembered that she did not have the bracelet. Immediately she placed it on her arm. Half an hour later, all the pains

ceased without reappearing, because she continued to wear her bracelet. About two to three weeks later, as she noticed that the ends of the metal conductor were very far apart because of the lengthening of the rubber belt of the circuit around her waist, the circuit was replaced by another one, this time containing a copper braid with a cross-section about 8 to 10 times larger than the conductor of the first circuit. The hands and feet of the patient, which since childhood had always been very cold, almost icy, warmed up to a normal temperature which, with the circuit, was always maintained.

N.B. - The daughter (13 years old) of the patient, who has also been wearing an oscillating circuit around her waist for several months and who, like her mother, has always had very cold extremities before, when asked by her mother if she wanted a circuit with a stronger section, replied that she did not need one because, during this winter (and therefore since she has been wearing the Lakhovsky oscillating circuit), she had always had warm hands and feet.

Mr. H., 61 years old, Rome. - Diagnosis : Polisarcie

The patient is from a family of uraemics, she weighs 120 kg. She suffered from stabbing pains in the lumbar regions. Not much appetite. Great difficulty in moving. When she was sitting, it took her 3 or 4 minutes to get up. She was obliged by her occupations to go away and come back home four times a day, she was obliged to use a means of locomotion, this small journey being impossible for her to make even on foot. On December 12, 1927, a Lakhovsky oscillating circuit was applied around her waist; 3 or 4 days later, the pain in the lumbar region disappeared. She regained her appetite and after 3 months no longer needed to walk to and from the streetcar stop, which she now does four times a day. Even though she is sitting in a very low chair, she can get up with the greatest of ease.

Following these observations, Professor Sordello Attilj concludes his report as follows:

The few cases cited, which represent only the beginning of the work we want to develop, show that the use of Lakhovsky oscillating circuits is really effective. When one thinks of the tragic fate of the cancer patient, who is rapidly heading towards death in the midst of pain that is sometimes

impossible to alleviate by any means and with disorders of all the organs, one can say that any symptom that is alleviated represents a work of charity for the poor patients.

There is no doubt, therefore, that good and generous souls will understand the usefulness of spreading the Lakhovsky method and will become apostles of it. The small sacrifices made, the time spent in this good work, will be amply rewarded by the great joy given by the feeling of good accomplished for those who suffer from the most terrible of the scourges that overwhelm humanity.

OTHER OBSERVATIONS MADE IN FRANCE BY PATIENTS AND DOCTORS

The Miraculous Necklace

On Thursday, December 29, 1927, Mr. Lakhovsky was kind enough to give me his famous, guërissevu- necklace for Mrs. D..., who has been suffering for several months from her legs and has been in a state of singular despondency for several weeks. Mrs. D. is a " pblébitée ". She had a cure in Bagnoles last June. Instead of bringing her the usual relief, this cure seems to have been, this time, rather harmful to her. Strange troubles in her legs, impressions of burning, bubbling, caused her great discomfort and especially gave rise to intolerable apprehensions. She was constantly lying down, did not dare to walk anymore, and was very tired after the slightest movement. On the other hand, her nights were not good. Frequent insomnia kept her awake for long hours. It was under these conditions that she put the collar around her neck. From the first night, things improved. She slept peacefully, without stopping, for 8 hours. The following nights were even better. Mrs. D. stayed in bed for 10 hours, with a pleasure that she no longer knew. She finally took a real rest.

She felt enveloped, bathed in a very soft warmth. Her legs, little by little, ceased to occupy her; the irritating phenomena of which they were the seat, little by little, disappeared. She was able to walk, to go about her business, which, during those days, were numerous, without the discomfort returning. Her stomach digested wonderfully. A general well-being was produced, which translated outside, by a cheerfulness, a spirit long forgotten. This lasted 6 days. Mrs. D., on the seventh night, was bothered by the heat; she assumed that the collar was the cause and she left it. Immediately, she found herself less at ease. The digestions were painful and were accompanied by burning. She was less alert, less lively in her movements. Her eyes lost their sharpness, it seemed that the life in her no longer had the same intensity. And sleep again came... However, the legs remain in excellent condition. The improvement seems to be lasting. After 5 days, she put the collar back on, in order to regain the well-being she had experienced during 6 unforgettable days. This resumption immediately brought back life, joy, sleep, and regularized all functions. It is truly a miracle. Done in Paris, January 12, 1928.

Dear Sir,

A very small word in the midst of my absorbing, - I should say my terrible occupations. Everyone is astonished, I myself am amazed at the crushing task that I have been supporting for more than a month without faltering. It is a miracle.

I don't always sleep for 6 hours; at 4 o'clock in the morning I am on my feet so much the work is absorbing. I work in the same difficult conditions as you know, 14 hours a day; I talk for 7 hours; add all the worries that my organization entails. And yet, I don't feel any fatigue. The mind remains lucid, and the imagination keeps its fradcbaur. I have no time for exercise; I am never out in the open. Logically, therefore, I should be sick, exhausted, drained. But I am up and about, alert, in good spirits, healthy. To what would I attribute such a state of health, if not to the Lahhovsky Collar? My life is a real challenge to common sense for those who do not know the mysterious influence that surrounds and sustains me. But I believe that, for some organisms, this influence occurs slowly by an insensible progress, it took 7 months for me to feel it with evidence, and in such a continuous way. For Mrs. D., the effect was much more rapid, as you will recall. However, her legs were only really relieved after several months. She told you, I think, that they were back to normal. No more swelling, no more tingling, no more burning or discomfort of any kind. I think it is essential that those who distribute your ingenious invention recommend patience. Do not leave the collar day or night for months if necessary. The happy effect cannot fail to occur. This is what I thought was urgent to tell you. I will go and thank you once again in person, as soon as I have the slightest freedom. In any case, I beg you, dear Sir, to be assured of my profound gratitude.

Observation.

Mrs. J., 53 years old, noticed on February 15 the presence of a small tumor in her right breast. Two days later, this tumor is the seat of pain which intensifies rapidly. On February 23, a sample of the tumor was taken for analysis. The analysis revealed that the tumor was clearly neoplastic and that its evolution was extremely rapid, with a serious prognosis. On March 9, the right breast and a huge lymph node mass were removed. During the following days, the patient's general condition was poor, the temperature oscillated between 39° in the morning and 40.2° in the evening. After about eight days, the surgical wound had not yet begun to scar, the temperature, although it had dropped, never fell below 38.5° in the evening; the patient was extremely weak, ate little, digested poorly and did not sleep. Around April 15, the situation was almost stationary, the surgical wound tended to close in the armpit area, but on the breast side the opening was still, it seems, very recent and the large loss of substance was not yet in the process of budding.

On April 16, the patient wears for the first time the Lakhovsky Oscillating Collar which she has not left since. Almost at once the sleep becomes better, the digestive functions easier, the temperature goes down appreciably and hardly exceeds 37,2° in the morning, 37,6° in the evening. After about a week, it appears clearly that the wound wants to close with more speed and the loss of substance is the seat of very clear budding. Today, a very noticeable change, the series of dressings is coming to an end and will probably be finished in about ten days, after which the patient will leave for the South. The general state is much better, the appetite normal, the digestive functions excellent. The temperature oscillates between 36°,8 and 37°,5.

Sir, I thank you for your work which I received a few weeks ago and which I wanted to read. I had the greatest pleasure in reading it. I would like to point out an interesting case for your method. The boy is 14 years old. Flu-like angina with pultaceous form - parasite - thrush. A very clean thrush, checked on culture, growing back with the greatest ease, requiring repeated daily application of alkali. Pale atonic underlying mucosa not defending; painful nodes at the base of the neck. No other parasitism. Observation I. - Mr. P. E..., 81 years old. Past history in recent years: phlebitis of the legs with small painful varicose ulcers; phlebitis of the right arm with consequent limitation of movements; two broncho-pneumonias having left cardiac arrhythmia and oedema of the bases. In 1922, a prostatic squirrel (Marion) with almost complete retention of urine was discovered. The general state of health only allowed a deep irradiation of the tumor (Jolly). In 1927: phlebotic attack, open varicose ulcers, cardio-pulmonary collapse which required total bed rest or room rest all winter 1927-1928; at the same time, continuous temperature attacks and complete retention of urine with infection. It seems that there is only congestion on the side of the prostate, the tumor appearing hardly increased in volume. In August 1928, the patient arrived at Oeauville where he had to stay in his room, his urinary infirmity preventing any outing, disturbed moreover by dyspnea due to efforts; moreover, he complained of a burning thirst and a continual tendency to narcolepsy. In addition to the usual care, he received a Lahhovsky oscillating collar in August. He returned home in September and little by little his general condition improved, his leg ulcers closed, so that he could go out again for a few hours without fatigue and without the constant urge to urinate; he regained his appetite and his sleep; his thirst diminished and his urine became almost clear.

At the end of October, he removes his collar without importance and without warning. At that moment, the swelling of the bases, a little temperature, dirty urine, fatigue, and the need to interrupt the outings reappeared. In November, he received a new collar. At present the troubles have disappeared, he starts to go out again and he approaches his winter in an improved state on that of the previous years.

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Dear Sir, I have noted some observations which I thought would be of interest to you, I have noted some observations which I thought would interest you. Observations collected from people wearing M. Lakhovsky's necklaces or belts, since November 1928. First case. - Mrs. L., 76 years old, Deauville. Suffered from rheumatism since the age of 40; had three cures in Dax with momentary improvement. For several years, progressive difficulty in walking, very frequent attacks treated alternately with injections of naiodin, iodinjectol, iodoseptine, morphine, without appreciable result the last three years. On November 29, she started the trial of the collar, which she has not left since. All other treatment was completely suppressed, the patient recognized the complete transformation of her general state that was manifested in her entire person; she could go out, take short walks, rested very well at night and did not need to take any injections during this period

of time; she admitted to feeling 20 years younger. In recognition, she became a propagator of the method that had been so successful for her, near her family and friends.

Second case. - Mr. P. 41 years old, son of the first one, Deauville Gouty rheumatism since the end of the war, had made several cures in Contrexeville without appreciable result, usually treated with salicylate and colchicine without notable improvement. Has been wearing the collar since the beginning of December; has seen his condition gradually improve. Left the collar for 8 days and was taken back by a new crisis. Put the collar back on yesterday morning.

Third case. - Mrs. L..., age 44, Deauville. In June 1928, had a uterine hemorrhage which made her fear the necessity of a surgical intervention. The condition having improved, the project of operation was abandoned; but the patient kept a persistent pain in the left ovary with impaction of the tube. Very bad circulation; oedema of the face, hands, ankles. Frequent dizziness, general lassitude leading the patient insensitively to neurasthenia. Three syncopations in October and November. Unable to make any effort to react and go out. Nights agitated by insomnia and nightmares.

On December 7, on the advice of her eldest daughter, I went to see her and found her prostrate in her armchair; she agreed to try the influence of the necklace, which she has not left since and has the joy of seeing her condition gradually improve. She only had a dizziness on the 8th and since then has not noticed any more of these disturbing phenomena. The nights have become normal. She sleeps well and has resumed her duties as a very active housewife within her family and is able to go on fairly long errands without being inconvenienced.

Fourth case. - Miss R..., 23 years old, kept from a serious anemia going back to a few years of circulatory troubles which completely disappeared since December 7th, date when she started to wear the collar.

Fifth case. - Miss S., 16 years old, Deauville. Operated on her appendix in June 1927, she had dull pains at the level of the scar, which became more pronounced at the time of her menstruation and provoked irregular vomiting at that time. She received the collar on December 7, the first following days were even more painful than usual. The patient was suffering from an unaccustomedly violent pain in her scar, and had to go to

bed. After a day of rest, the patient calmed down and since then she has not felt anything in the area of the seam, which has stopped being painful. The reported phenomena suggest that there must have been scar adhesions which maintained the dull pains and caused the periodic vomiting and that these adhesions must have yielded to the influences of the collar in the acute crisis reported, since the following periods passed normally. To confirm this opinion, here is an additional detail: the collar was abandoned on January 6 after a few days; the patient felt less well and again accused the doxileur on the operated side. I saw the patient again after a few days when she had taken back her repaired collar; she declared that she was again very well.

Sixth case. - Mr. L., 45 years old, Deauville. Very sanguine. Circulatory problems. He is more comfortable since December by wearing a belt. His son, André, who suffered a lot from kidneys, also wears the belt efficiently since the same date.

Seventh case. - Mrs. L..., 71 years old, in Littry (Calvados). Generalized rheumatism. She has been wearing the collar since December 14, 1928, and amazes all those around her by the transformation that has occurred in her condition since that date. The effect was so sudden and so solved that her family is amazed. She does not know how to express her gratitude for the benefit of the necklace which gives her such a happy old age.

Eighth case. - Mrs. H., 43 years old, Touques (Calvados). Had a phlebitis two years ago after a late pregnancy. Agreed to try the influence of the collar on December 8, 1928; the sick leg became normal again after a few days. The collar is removed in January. The leg swells again until the collar is put back on. The D. L...., from T..., to whom I gave my collar, had to undergo the operation for stomach ulcer. H is doing as well as possible and is to be discharged from the clinic next Saturday; I will follow closely the progress of his convalescence and the recovery of his strength and will keep you informed. On March 26, 1928, I sent you an observation concerning Mrs. L..., about 60 years old, suffering from simple diabetes mellitus with asthenia that I treated with the Lakhovsky collar. Since then, this patient is doing wonderfully. Not only does she no longer have to rest and sit in a deck chair, but she works all day without the slightest fatigue and she recently told me that her health has never been so good.

Here is another extremely interesting case! Mrs. Louise F..., 35 years old. Operated in 1914 for hydatid cyst of the liver and appendicitis. In 1922, general disorders characterized by deep asthenia, frequent lypotimia, vomiting. Urea dosage: 0,26 (in the blood). Absence of sugar in the urine. Ptosis of the right kidney which was very painful to palpation. After this serious crisis, the patient was operated a few months later by Professor Gosset for nephropexy. Following this operation, the patient did not suffer much for about two years; but in 1925 the troubles reappeared. The patient always complained of a general feeling of weakness, insomnia that was resistant to any therapy and sometimes of abdominal pain. Several successive radiographic examinations of her digestive tract and gall bladder revealed nothing abnormal. The repeated stay in the country and several cures in Vichy slightly improved the condition of the patient without however giving her the hoped-for cure because asthenia and insomnia were still causing her pain. Because of her suffering and general weakness, she was forced to leave her job as an accountant. In April 1928, her general condition was still unchanged; even after an energetic restorative treatment, recently followed, and a prolonged stay in the country, the patient still

complained of weakness, insomnia, dyspeptic disorders, etc. It is at this moment that I advise her to wear the Lakhovsky necklace. My advice is accepted after a strong insistence from my part, but with a skeptical smile from the patient. No news from my patient until September 15, day when she came back to see me begging me to give her another necklace, because hers had broken 5 days before. She told me that her weakness, insomnia and dyspeptic problems had disappeared after the first week of wearing the necklace. In 5 months, she had gained more than 6 kilos. I gave her another collar and the patient left very happy, because this time she was sure that she would not suffer anymore. In January, she wrote me that she was doing very well and that she had resumed her job as an accountant, which she had left years ago; another letter dated February 2 confirmed her recovery and her departure for Lyon, where she had been offered a new and very important position as head accountant in a large industry; Her talisman (that's how she calls her necklace) doesn't leave her anymore and a reserve of three other necklaces that she bought before leaving is always ready to replace the one she wears in case it should get damaged. There is no doubt, therefore, that the use of the Lakhovsky oscillating circulatory system has, in the case of this unfortunate patient, brought about a true resurrection. I can therefore, to conclude this observation, only borrow the words of Professor SordeUo Attilj of Rome that "the theories of M. Lakhovsky can find a wide application not only in the treatment of cancer, but also in that of other diseases" and that this new therapeutic method, really very effective, must be known by all physicians and widely spread.

CONCLUSIONS

It follows from Mr. Lakhovsky's theories, as well as from the observations we have published above, that the action of the oscillating circuit is not specific for this or that disease. A few weeks later it would be too late to try with certain success the surgical removal of the disease or the above mentioned treatments. "I have never advised to apply my oscillating circuits in hospitals only to patients who can be operated surgically or treated with radium, etc. There is nothing to prevent you from providing the patients with oscillating circuits when surgery or medicine have already begun their classical treatments. This way, if surgery or medical intervention fails, you will be sure, if not to cure the patient, at least to stop the disease, to localize it and to eliminate the suffering. In desperate cases, we have seen patients without these circuits die without suffering. "We have observed in some cases, like Professor Attilj, notable improvements that have lasted for three years in patients abandoned by medicine and surgery. But we must be very careful in our conclusions and wait to see if recurrences or metastases do not occur later. "I will conclude that, since my oscillating circuits have been able to act effectively on dying patients, they can a fortiori be used successfully as a preventive means. But I repeat that, for nothing in the

world, it would be necessary to renounce to turn to surgery and medicine at the beginning of the disease to adopt exclusively my oscillating circuits, whereas I never wanted to try this experiment myself. I never wanted to try this experiment myself, because the time that this terrible disease gives us to use the means that science offers us today is so short that the slightest negligence in treating oneself can be fatal. So at the slightest suspicion of cancer, run immediately to the doctor. "We respectfully bow to the will of Mr. Lakhovsky, publishing this statement of the inventor. However, since it has been possible, according to these many observations, to stop and reverse this terrible disease, it should be possible to cure it from the beginning by applying the oscillating circuit method. But we recommend to the reader to follow the careful advice of M. Lakhovsky.
